As part of the Living with Threatened Species in the Kenilworth/Belli Community project a group of interested people is being formed and you are invited to help form the backbone. The aim of the group is manifold:

- Finding new sites for threatened frogs in the district
- Long-term monitoring of frog populations at selected sites
- Helping to maintain bushland at Pioneer Park on Gheerulla Creek and Belli Park on Belli Creek in conjunction with Maroochy Shire Council / Greening Australia rehabilitation activities
- Helping with rehabilitation activities of potential and known frog habitats on private properties in the area
- Joining with others who have similar interests and goals for the local environment
- Ensuring that the work initiated by the project continues in the long-term

Frog hunting and rehabilitation activities are fun and very educational for adults and kids. The presence of frogs often indicates that an area is in good condition. Ensuring that they persist in the environment enables us to arrest degradation before it becomes serious and expensive to rectify. The benefits are transferred along the whole length of the Mary River.
