**WHY report koala sightings?** The koala is on the threatened species list as 'vulnerable' to extinction. Citizen Science (your observations) provides data that can guide conservation efforts and influence decision-makers and planners.

**HOW do I report my koala sighting?** If you see a koala anywhere, observe it quietly, check it is healthy and safe (call for advise if unsure) and record and report the sighting. (Get a photo if you can)

**If you have a computer at home**: go to Koala Tracker, the user-friendly citizen-science site for koala sightings. <u>www.koalatracker.com.au</u> Join up, and record your sighting. You can also upload photos.

Once you have done that, please drop us a quick email so we know there is a new sighting! (<u>koalas@mrccc.org.au</u>) or message us on Facebook. We can then enter your koala sighting into the State Government 'Wildnet' data base.
