

Use the key below to identify the 10 frogs shown in the pictures that follow.

1	Does the frog have toe pads? Yes: Go to 2 No: Go to 5
2	Is the frog greater than 6 cm when fully grown? Yes: Go to 3 No: Go to 4
3	Is the frog's pupil cross-shaped? Yes: Emerald spotted treefrog (<i>Litoria peronii</i>) No: Green treefrog (<i>Litoria caerulea</i>)
3	Are the fingers webbed? Half-webbed: Orange-eyed Treefrog (<i>Litoria chloris</i>) No webbing on fingers, toes partially webbed: Go to 4
4	Is the head very pointed? Yes: Striped Rocketfrog (<i>Litoria nasuta</i>) No: Green-thighed frog (<i>Litoria brevipalmata</i>)
5	Is the frog smaller than 3 cm when fully grown? Yes: Clicking Froglet (<i>Crinia signifera</i>) No: Go to 6
6	Are the (back) feet webbed? Yes: Go to 7 No, or only slight webbing: Go to 8
7	Are the frog's eyes golden? Yes: Giant Barred Frog (<i>Mixophyes iteratus</i>) No: Great Barred Frog (<i>Mixophyes fasciolatus</i>)
8	Does the frog have dark stripes running down its back? Yes: Striped Marsh Frog (<i>Limnodynastes peronii</i>) No: Ornate Burrowing Frog (<i>Platyplectrum ornatum</i>)

Note - this is not a complete frog identification key, so it won't work for other frogs in your area. If you want a more complete frog key to identify frogs in your area, try the following websites:
